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## Media Release:

### **6<sup>th</sup> Road Project of RInfra's SPV in Haryana goes Operational**

- **RInfra SPV completes widening of Gurgaon-Faridabad-Ballabhgarh-Sohna road**
- **Starts tolling operation for 66 kms Gurgaon-Faridabad-Ballabhgarh-Sohna road**
- **Project is on BOT basis with project cost of Rs.800 crore and concession period of 17 years**
- **Traveling time for commuters now reduced by more than an hour**
- **With this, RInfra SPV's six road projects are operational and generating revenue**
- **RInfra SPVs currently have 11 road projects of 1000 kms valued at Rs.12,000 crore**

**Mumbai, July 1, 2012:** Reliance Infrastructure Limited (RInfra), part of Reliance Group, has commenced the operation of its sixth road project through its Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV), GF Toll Road Private Limited from Gurgaon to Faridabad. The four laning of Gurgaon - Faridabad and two laning of Ballabhgarh - Sohna road have been completed and toll collections have been started.

It is RInfra SPV's first State road project, executed on BOT (Build, Operate and Transfer) pattern, under the aegis of Haryana Public Works Department, Government of Haryana. The project will be transferred back to the Government after 17 years concession period, during which time the road will be operated and maintained by RInfra's SPV.

Built at a cost of Rs.800 crore, Gurgaon Faridabad corridor connects major tourist destinations, industrial zones, corporate offices and International airport (T3) of Delhi. This 66 kms long corridor includes Gurgaon-Faridabad, Ballabhgarh-Sohna, Pali Bakri, Surajkund Road.

The 25 kms Gurgaon-Faridabad road starting from Gurgaon's Mehrauli Road at Sikanderpur and ending at the junction of Pali Bhakri road in Faridabad, involved widening of the existing two lane road to four lanes. The 6 kms of Municipal Corporation of Faridabad road leading to Surajkund and 3 kms of Crusher Zone Road were also constructed for the benefit of the commuters.

The 28 kms Ballabhgarh- Sohna (BS) road starting from Ballabhgarh (35kms on Delhi-Mathura Road) and ending at Rewari – Palwal involved re-construction and widening of two lanes. This stretch also includes 4 kms road from Pali village to Faridabad – Gurgaon junction.

Commenting on this development, **Mr. Lalit Jalan, CEO, Reliance Infrastructure**, said ***“We are happy to complete the widening and start the operation of our sixth road project that will ensure smooth traffic flow from Gurgaon to Faridabad and Ballabhgarh to Sohna. This will increase commuting convenience and connect centers of tourism, International airport, industrial zones and places of economic importance. Some section of the corridor with dangerous curves and steep rises have been realigned, so that commuters can maintain the minimum design speed and enjoy a comfortable ride. The corridor will witness approximately 36,000 vehicles per day that is expected to double in the next five years.”***

He further added ***“Road sector is a key business for Reliance Infrastructure as it gives minimum targeted return on equity and enhances the valuation of our existing Road Portfolio. With current order book of eleven road projects, we will generate from next financial year a revenue of Rs.1200 crore per year with 15% y-o-y growth rate.”***

The average vehicle speed on this corridor now will go up from 12km/hr to 60km/hr, thereby reducing the traveling time by 40% - 50% and saving almost 40% on fuel cost. Commuters traveling the entire stretch of Gurgaon - Faridabad - Ballabhgarh - Sohna road can now cover this distance in less than two hours whereas earlier this same distance used to take almost five hours. With the opening of Gurgaon Faridabad road, access to International Airport of Delhi (Terminal T3) for Faridabad residents became easier and closer. Gurgaon-Faridabad corridor connects major industrial and tourist destinations of New Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, Haryana and Rajasthan.

Keeping the traffic density in mind, fourteen lanes toll plaza are constructed at Gurgaon Faridabad road and six lanes toll plaza at Crusher Zone. Also, two Toll Plazas of six lanes each are located on Ballabhgarh Sohna stretch - one is at 11 kms from Ballabhgarh and another is at 28 kms.

Apart from collecting tolls, these toll plazas will have a Control Room that will help in locating the accident site and provide required emergency services within minimum response time. 24x7 Ambulance services will be available to handle any emergency issues. Two patrolling cars will also patrol the entire corridor 24x7, to ensure the safety and security of the commuters. The corridor will also have eleven bus shelters with various commuter centric facilities like RO drinking water kiosks, Truck Lay byes etc.
